



"Constitution Day (17) and Constitution Week" September 17-23, 2018

Constitution Day, previously known as Citizens Day, was established on August 2, 1956 by President Dwight D. Eisenhower, for the purpose of commemorating the adoption and signing of the United States Constitution (Sept. 17, 1787). In 2004 a law was put forth mandating educational institutions, that receive federal funding, to hold educational programs for their students for the sole purpose of teaching them about the Constitution. This incredibly thoughtful and insightful document is the foundation of our country and our American way. It is a document like no other ever seen before and it is truly remarkable. The integrity and forethought provided by our founding fathers has survived for 230 years as one of the oldest surviving forms of democracy to date. OEC vs SP

(Original Equipment Colors vs Special Colors)

Since 1998 most Original Equipment (OE) convertible vehicle manufacturers have been moving away from vinyl convertible topping. In response Haartz Auto Fabric is no longer stocking many of these older less popular OE colors. Where does that leave us (Trimmers & Electron 70%)?

Haartz offers a "Special Run" program that enables us to have produced minimum orders of 500 yards of any discontinued vinyl colors with additional costs. Over the years we have slowly been investing into runs of some of these older colors in order to keep them available to the Trim Industry. As we run these new colors the prefix will be changed from (OE) to (SP) and priced accordingly. You may have noticed some have already been converted on previous color charts but we forsee this occuring more frequently and wanted to give you a current update so you can correct your color chart.

OE10 Firethorn/Blk = SP10
OE12 Ford Blue/Blk = SP12 (available September)
OE13 Lt Blue/Blk = SP13
OE16 Med Grey/Blk = SP16 (available September)
OE28 GM Med Blue/Blk = SP28

Colors still in stock but on the horizon for a special run are the following: **OE06** Walnut Brown/Blk **OE07** Dark Green/Blk **OE18** GM Fischer White/Tan **OE22** Mustang Saddle/Blk


