



Caring for Your Convertible Soft Top

With these simple care tips, your quality soft top can last 10 years or even longer.

Do...

1. Pull over whenever you want to raise or lower your convertible soft top.
2. Use your hand to gently remove snow or ice off the top and rear window before driving.
3. Vacuum the top with a brush attachment to remove bird droppings and other particles before hand washing it with warm water and RaggTopp™ cleaner.
4. Gently scrub your top with a RaggTopp™ Premium Convertible Top Brush. The bristles are designed to clean the top without ruining the fabric.
5. Allow your top to completely air dry. Then spray the entire top with RaggTopp™ Protectant to shield the vinyl or cloth from harmful UV rays, as well as repel salt, dirt and mildew.
6. Have a professional service your top immediately after noticing something wrong. A small problem can quickly turn into a costly one if you're not quick to respond.

Don't...

1. Raise or lower the top of a pre-2000 car in motion. It can damage the top and frame. It's possible to do on some later-model cars, but usually only up to speeds of 15 mph.
2. Attempt to drive the car with the convertible only partially raised or lowered. You will bend or break the frame.
3. Leave any hard or bulky objects in the boot, where the top stows away. They could rip the top, bend the frame, pierce a plastic window or shatter a glass one.
4. Use a scraper to remove ice or snow from the top or rear window. You'll damage it.
5. Lower a wet top. It will soak the stow-away area and create mildew, which will ruin the top and stink up the car.
6. Take your convertible vehicle through an automated car wash. Aggressive brushes and harsh chemicals can ruin the top and window.
7. Leave a top lowered for days on end. It could cause wrinkles that will take a while to come out.
8. Disassemble or try to repair a convertible top yourself. It takes professionals many years to learn how to do it. Any mistake you make will be expensive to repair.
